

The music is the prelude to the arrival of the ice cream.

As we enter this season of Easter, the church is called to begin playing a new tune in the world. The music of the resurrection must rise forth from the church as good news for all people. As heralds of the gospel we announce that Jesus lives. This good news melody rises above the bad news song of a world broken by sin with a message of hope, peace, and joy. The message of Easter can now spread through the streets of our world as an invitation to all to be made new and whole.

The angelic messengers of the first Easter began the song when the women came to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus. To the grieving women the angels announced:

“He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him.”

This good news continues to be sung today. As recipients of the Easter message we now go forth into the world and proclaim the good news of Easter. Empowered by the Holy Spirit we have a story to tell to a world which has for too long listened to the music of sin, brokenness, and despair. The joyous news of Jesus' resurrection changes everything. We now live to a new melody and with a new song in our hearts. Christ is risen! Christ is alive. Alleluia!

Clint's Corner

In the summer of 1939, then Senator Harry Truman said, "When we are honest enough to recognize each others' rights and are good enough to respect them, we will come to a more Christian settlement of our difficulties." Now, I didn't know Mr. Truman personally, but this sounds like a pretty good statement to me. It's a statement that reminds me of a few thoughts I had on the subject of justice back in 2004.

To be "just" in the Old Testament was to be pleasing to God (i.e., doing that which was pleasing to God; that which was right and good). Our definition of justice today is not far removed from this. The American Heritage Dictionary defines justice as: (1) moral, rightness, equity; (2) honor, fairness; (3) fair handling; (4) to approach with proper appreciation. If one is to be just, they should be morally right, equitable, honorable, and fair. But perhaps it is the last definition that hits it on the head, for if we are to be just we must approach others with proper appreciation. If, for example, we do not have a proper appreciation for our neighbors, then there's no way we can be just toward them. And a proper appreciation of our neighbor calls us back to being able to love someone because of the God that lives within them. If we were to all approach one another with the appreciation and love of the God living within us all, we might then hope to act justly toward them. This seems to be a portion of the message Harry Truman was trying to convey to his audience.

So, is seeking justice (being just, acting justly) more of a proper state of heart and mind than anything? We typically think of "seeking" as going out and looking for something, but maybe the place we need to look is within ourselves. If we can set our heart and mind to approaching others with an appreciation for the God within them, then perhaps we will be able to treat them with fair, morally right, and equitable actions. In doing so, we will not only find justice, but execute it as well. And so, our personal calling card might read:

APPROACH WITH PROPER APPRECIATION.

In taking this approach, things like rescuing the oppressed, defending the orphan, and pleading for the widow should follow naturally. "And justice for all" suddenly becomes more than a catch phrase, more than an idea, and more than a vision for what might one day be...it becomes a reality – and the kingdom of God just got a little bigger.




