M*A*S*H is an American war comedy-drama television series that aired on CBS from 1972 to 1983. It told the story of a Mobile Army Surgical Hospital during the Korean War. 256 episodes were made and are still some of the most watched shows in reruns. In one episode, surgeon B.J. Honeycutt receives from his wife a book in the mail entitled *The Rooster Crowed at Midnight*. According to the jacket blurb, the book was "another brain-teasing, spine-chilling whodunit from the prize-winning pen of Abigail Porterfield." The jacket blurb also described Abigail Porterfield as a

97-year old lady who had been residing in Sydney, Australia for the last 60 years. The bored MASH staff soon passed the book around, sometimes a chapter or a page at a time. However, when they get to the end of the story, the final pages are not in the book. The story ends in mid sentence with no conclusion to the mystery. They are left trying to come to a conclusion on their own. There is more of the story to be told.

When Jesus died on Good Friday's cross, everyone thought they knew how the story had ended. Jesus, a good and righteous man with a following, had been put to death. His broken body had been placed in a borrowed tomb for burial. The story was over. Yet, three days later, women who had come to the tomb to pay their respects to the dead were greeted by the living. Jesus, who had been crucified, had been resurrected. The horror of the cross had been replaced by the hallelujah of Easter. The story the early followers believed had come to a tragic end had more to be told. Jesus was alive and this good news would transform his followers into a powerful Spirit-led force to go forth and tell the rest of the story.

As Christians today, we know the rest of the story. In a world that seems sometimes to be stuck in the darkness of Good Friday, we bear witness to the joyful news of Easter. We are not messengers of defeat but of victory. The apostle Paul would remind us of this calling in his letter to the Corinthian Church:

Thanks be to God, who in Christ always leads us in triumphal procession, and through us spreads in every place the fragrance that comes from knowing him. For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing; to the one a fragrance from death to death, to the other a fragrance from life to life. Who is sufficient for these things? For we are not peddlers of God's word like so many; but in Christ we speak as persons of sincerity, as persons sent from God and standing in his presence.

We are a people of the resurrection story. A story that now impels us into the world with its good news. The story of Easter must never get lost in the pages of our lives, but must rather guide our lives in everything that we do. The tomb is empty, and our hearts are now full of life, love, joy, and hope. We've got something to talk about. We are now part of the story to be told.




